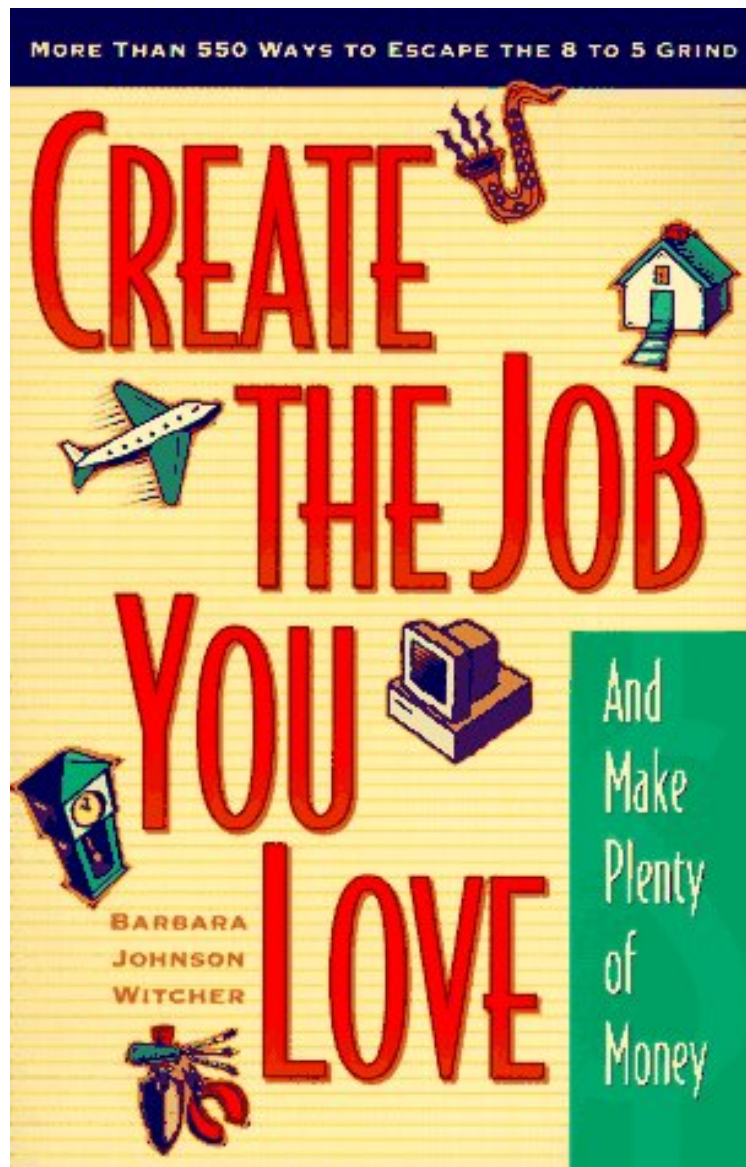

You get the option of identifying with 11 jobs from which all the rest are derived. Then she goes on to "describe" jobs. Each job gets a one paragraph explanation along with training and earning information. The training information tells you stuff like "you'll need acting ability" in order to become an actor or the trade secret of physicians - they have to go to medical school! Her information on compensation typically says "you'll be paid a salary", "you'll be paid a fee", or "your income is generated from what you charge for your work." My heart goes out to those who need to spend \$14 for this sort of advice. The only surprise in the book was under the job description of "Cruise Ship Featured Guest" which could be "an attractive single man who will dance with a variety of female guests."
